Pupil Premium Report September 2023

All schools receive additional income called the pupil premium (PP). This money is allocated by the Government to help schools support children with low income families and children in care. The amount of additional funding schools received is based on the number of children who are entitled to receive free school meals in the last 6 years or who are looked after children.

Nationally, pupil premium students make less progress when compared to non-pupil premium students, for example there is a large gap in the attainment of both groups in terms of progress 8 scores. Pupil Premium money has been given to help schools close the gap.
