Year 12 A Level trip to Norfolk - 3 day residential

On 30th June, we set off in the baking sun to North Norfolk, in the east of England. After a brief stop off, some peanuts, a grilled cheese sandwich and a change of driver, we arrived at Kingswood Centre in Overstrand on time and in high spirits. We took a walk through the house grounds to the beach at Overstrand and immediately got a sense of the work we had ahead of us - the coastline was heavily defended, and the glacial till which made up the geology of the cliffs was so soft it crumbled between our fingers. Mass movement and slumping along the coastline was already evident - and is part of the main reason we chose to go to this part of the coastline to conduct fieldwork.



Our tutor at the centre met with us and we began brainstorming what we wanted to investigate. We planned the questions, methods of investigation we would use, and well as the most suitable fieldsites along the coast. We were ready and prepared for the following day. The human fieldwork techniques that we planned to use were for the students to practice and iron out any issues so that when the actual fieldsite in London has been selected, it's clear what the student has to do.



Straight after breakfast we headed out in the minibus to our first fieldsite at Weybourne, a beautiful undefended part of the coastline that has a protected area for birds right behind the beach. The students worked well together to gather data on wind speed, wind direction and the speed of the longshore drift that transports sediment along the coastline, usually in the direction of the wind. We were investigating how effective coastal protection is along this coastline. As predicted this had the fastest rate of transportation as there was no coastal defences to slow these processes down.



The next site was at Sheringham which is a protected coastline. Here the coastal protection slowed the rate of transportation by longshore drift the most. The sea defences were well maintained too - which was additional data that we needed to collect. The students then went into the town of Sheringham to conduct the human fieldwork - looking at



the relationship between the urban environment, deprivation and crime. They conducted a mood survey, a questionnaire and an environmental quality survey. Finally we ended up in Overstrand, the last fieldsite



for the physical fieldwork, where the rate of transportation was in between the two previous places. This is because the coastal defences along this coastline were no longer being maintained, and their damage was clear to see. This meant that they were less effective, which was evidenced by the data gathered.

In the evening we had a fantastic chance to partake in some archery in the centre. The instructor was very impressed with the skill level of the group, and we had fun shooting balloons and getting points. Adrian was the overall champ - well done!

On the final day of the trip the students made sure that they had all their data and ideas clearly formulated. The human fieldwork was properly planned and methodologically clear so that it can be written up and evaluated in London over the summer.

Next, we wandered towards the Thames pathway and lunched at the Tate Modern where



pupils were able to go into the gallery and experience the collection of modern and contemporary art. After lunch it was across the Millennium Bridge towards St Pauls Cathedral and into the City of London to again photograph juxtaposition and contrasting architecture. Finally, we walked across the Barbican looking at examples of Brutalist architecture before returning to school. The day was both enjoyable and informative with students gathering plenty of images to support their work in year 11.

This year has been a truly positive and impactful one for girls' football at Hendon School. We're proud to be at the forefront of increasing access and opportunities for girls in sport. 2024-25 has marked a turning point in our commitment to growing the game.

The Year 8 girls football team have really kick started women's football within Hendon School. Their commitment to weekly training has been superb and we have had over 30 girls in attendance every Thursday lunch time. The numbers of girls continued to increase which encouraged more girls to join and sessions moved to Thursday after school.

The girls are not only a team but have also been a solid friendship group throughout the year. Their passion, dedication and commitment to football has been amazing, leading the girls to finishing 3rd in their league and, even when the season had finished, devoting their lunchtimes to playing on the top court just so they could continue playing football. The girls have been so positive, respectful and helpful throughout the year and have been rewarded with trips and sports leadership opportunities. I am really impressed with the attitude and commitment to football from this team and group of friends and look forward to seeing their greater progression for next season.

In March, we launched a new partnership with local girls' football club Barnet Panthers. This partnership has been instrumental in increasing the number of girls at Hendon School playing football. On March 10th we held our annual International Women's Day Football Tournament. All girls in Years 7, 8 and 9 took part in a full day of competitive football at Powerleague. The energy, enthusiasm, and talent on display were truly inspiring!



Building on this momentum, in April we launched our community football training sessions in collaboration with Barnet Panthers, open to girls from Years 4 to 11 across Barnet for just £1. These weekly sessions, have been a huge success—creating a space where girls can play, grow, and fall in love with the game in an inclusive and supportive environment. We now have a growing number of girls playing football regularly each week—something we're incredibly proud of. These sessions are open to all girls and can be booked using the QR code on the flyer.



In June, we took another exciting step by hosting our first-ever primary schools girls' football tournament, welcoming schools from across Barnet for a full day of competition. The event saw an amazing 25 teams of Year 4 and 5 girls, over 200 players, and more than 400 minutes of football played. Our Year 8 girls football team supported the event and



took on a number of leadership roles, officiating all games. The day was filled with skill, spirit, and sportsmanship, and it was a joy to see so many young girls getting involved and enjoying the game.
