Course Outline:

Religious Studies is compulsory at KS4. The course allows students to gain a whole GCSE as well as develop a fuller understanding of religion in today's world. Students will cover a range of topics that will equip them to better operate in our modern multi-faith society. Students study Christian and Islamic views as well as non-religious and have the opportunity to discuss their own ideas in conjunction with other students. They will also learn the skills of argument and evaluation, as well as writing concise GCSE style answers. By the end of the course students will be in a better position to negotiate the complexities of religious teachings, media influence, and current political issues.
