Music Publisher

A music publisher secures, manages, and exploits the copyrights of musical compositions, acting as a bridge between songwriters/ composers and revenue sources. They promote songs for film/TV/ads, register works with collecting societies, and collect royalties. Key duties include creative A&R, copyright administration, and licensing to maximise income.

This programme allows students to develop their skills and strengths and meet inspiring members of our EY Black Community.

Registration for Fantasy Wings' 2026/27 programme is now open, and spaces in London, Birmingham, and Manchester are available!

Whether you're aged 13-25 and want to explore in-person sessions with hands-on experiences, or an adult looking to join virtually, this is your chance to discover a career in aviation—be it as a pilot, engineer, air traffic controller, or within the airport environment. Fantasy Wings has spent six years making aviation accessible, partnering with British Airways, easyJet, Virgin Atlantic, NATS, the CAA, and Manchester Airports Group to provide mentoring, work experience, and unique opportunities. Participants can access flying scholarships, build a network in the industry, and earn an accredited certificate upon completion.

OPPORTUNITIES

The Eton Summer University Preparation Courses (ESUPC) offer a free, non-residential university-style programme for Year 12 state school students, taking place during the first two weeks of July. The courses are designed to support ambitious students who would particularly benefit from additional guidance, such as those who are first in their family to attend university or who have faced personal or financial challenges. Interested students should apply using their school email and submit a short motivation (max 200 words) by Monday 16 March 2026. Places are limited and selection is based on application quality and level of need, with decisions shared by 27 April. Students will need to travel to Eton daily, and travel support may be available for eligible students. Please see the [attached information pack](#) for full details and application guidance.
