- Lead, support and ensure effectiveness of staff working in Music
- Lead and coordinate the implementation of Peri lessons.
- Contribute and implement student performance opportunities

Curriculum

- Ensure effective planning of schemes of work to ensure the needs of students of all abilities are met
- Oversee the provision for students with SEN including G&T and EHCP as appropriate
- Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of schemes of work
- Be responsible for students' data in Music and ensure that it is used to inform lesson planning, teaching styles and intervention
- Ensure high standards of performance across the ability range
- Oversee and monitor department use of rewards
- Monitor and evaluate tracking systems and the use of data to highlight success and identify/support underachievement
